
The meeting was called to order by Lorrie at 5:35. The minutes of the March 12, 2001 meeting were approved.

Lorrie announced that Tim Ingall will be the new VP for track. Tim is considering a summer track program.

Jim Miner reported no progress on the Rich Lawrence Memorial Bench. He has no response from Albany on his request to place the bench.

Race Reports:

Skunk Cabbage - Yvette reported that the race went well with a recent record turnout (426 finishers, see plot below). The race netted \$1622.54. 10% will go to the scholarship fund. Safety issues seemed to be well in hand, however next time Yvette suggested adding Cornell Police at the stoplight on 366. She is also considering the suggestion that we add a Clydesdale division.



Upcoming Races:

Tom B. Runs - Tessa reported that everything is in order, except she could use some help with aid stations and registration. Tessa will make a few minor changes in the course.

Tortoise and Hare - Jim Miner reported everything is ready to go. He can always use more volunteers.

Rec-Way 10K - Jeff Juran reported that everything seems to be together for the race. Again, more volunteers are needed.

Twilight 5K - Alan reported that volunteers are needed. Pub's run people (2) plus Jim LeBlanc will do the computer results/timing.

Finances:

John S. reported that our checkbook balance is approximately \$5,000. Balance in scholarship funds is \$670.75

Hartshorne Memorial Award:

Diane announced that Alan Lockett was this year's winner of the Hartshorne Memorial Award.

Computer Training:

Jim Bisogni reported that 6 people attended the training session and that they should be able to start working the races on their own.

Pud's Run:

FLRC will be consultants and trainers, their people will provide all the volunteers. We will provide equipment. Payment to the Club was not discussed, but the Pud's Run group will provide volunteers for the 5 & 10.

Scholarship Committee Report:

Alan announced that the scholarship committee awarded a scholarship to Yvette DeBoer who will receive an award of \$177.50 to participate in an Ironman triathlon training camp in preparation for the Lake Placid Ironman.

Newsletter:

Diane reported that the next newsletter is finished and has been slow to get mailed out. Diane discussed reciprocity for publishing race entries with the Syracuse Charges and the Triple Cities Track Club.

Web Page:

Craig reported that the counter on the web site is approaching 10000. He is presently working on changing the race entries from PDF to HTML format for more efficient downloading. Craig will leave the area in June so we will need to find another web master.

Equipment:

Herb and Jim Miner have equipment organized. Jim now has access to Herb's storage area so Jim should be the contact person for equipment.

VP Reports:

Trails: Joe Reynolds reported that trails are very dry. Herb commented that more runners should be attending hearings on the Black Diamond Trail so that our interests are represented.
