# **Current Events Reports & Business (5:40)**

Skunk Cabbage—Alex Kleinerman

- There are 302 preregistrants in the 10K and 669 in HM, as of today.
- Alex has secured 700 medals; if there end up being more HM finishers than medals, she intends to purchase more and mail them out as needed.
- Denice has been assembling volunteers, but some more course marshals are still desirable, largely to have a responsible club member be paired with college volunteers.
- No-headset policy:
  - o For the past few years, this race has strictly enforced a no-headset policy.
  - o Somehow the application and website omitted this detail for the 2015 race.
  - After this week's prerace email went out, Alex has received 10–15 complaints from runners saying that they would not have registered had they known they would have to run headset-less.
    - It is suggested that Alex offer a full refund to the unhappy entrants.
  - Alex's view will be to strongly discourage use of headphones, saying that individuals need to use good judgment, e.g., keep one earbud out.
  - Next year the information will be made quite overt.

# Thom B. Trail Runs—Joel Cisne

- All is in place, or in the works, for this race.
- There are 38 pre-registrants thus far, with some interest in the 52K option.
- Joel and Shelly are looking into getting bandanas.

# Girls on the Run—Mickie Jauquet (for Lorrie)

• Moravia's Register weekly paper published a nice notice recognizing The Finger Lakes Runners Club.

- Moravia has 19 girls signed up for the program, which commenced this past week.
- Beverly J. Martin has 8 girls, as of 3/27/15, and will accept up to 10; the program will begin next week.
  - o Lorrie will be the coach, along with one of the school's social workers.
- No count is yet available for the program in Lansing, although Lorrie believes it will start next week. Summer Picnic/Volunteer Picnic—Mickie Jauquet
  - A thought is circulating to include a picnic to celebrate FLRC's volunteers in conjunction with the Lucifer's Crossing/Monster Marathon weekend.
  - Joel will speak with lan to elicit his thoughts on this.
  - A few of concerns were voiced:
    - What might be the cost to club is a large number of people attend?
    - Relatedly, how to ensure that this picnic would be for FLRC volunteers, rather than generally
      including the others in attendance that weekend? The Monster races include a post-race feed; is
      this weekend the best time to include another meal?
    - o In contrast, our club picnics have historically been poorly attended; how best to get volunteers to show up for such a thank-you event?
  - The triathlon club's volunteer picnic is always well attended and wonderful, and, as the point person for that event, Alex is willing to advise the Volunteer Committee on making plans.

### Terracycle—Aaron Proujansky

- The Terracycle organization upcycles waste products like Gu packaging and granola bar packaging into useful items like backpacks.
- Collection is structured around "brigades" that collect a specific type of waste.
  - A successful Brigade receives incentives in the form of donations by Terracycle to charity of the brigade's choice.
- The "Gu Brigade" has open spots (doesn't have to be brand-specific; any gel packaging is acceptable), and the granola bar brigade has a waiting list, but we could get on and off it readily.
- Terrracycle will cover shipping of the collected materials, but only if a 5-pound minimum is met.
  - The consensus is that 5 pounds of waste is a great deal to collect. Suggested that should do the collection and pass the stuff to lan for his involvement.
- Ian has already established a Gu Brigade out of his store.
  - Rather than creating our own brigade, a better option would be to collect packaging and contribute it to lan's efforts.
- Question of how to propose collecting the wrappers at, say, the 50s?
  - Have baggies at the aid stations to collect the wrappers; also educate the runners and aid station workers on the process.
- Joel will try (no promises) to make a box to have at the Hashers' aid station at the Skunk Cabbage races.
- On a related note, Maria says that the recycling center lends out recycling bins to events to make it easy to collect bottles and cans; Maria will send around info about this.

# **Unfinished Business** (6:30)

Programming Philosophy—Joel Cisne/Mickie Jauguet

- The board considers how programming of nonrace events are to be managed, how to market nonrace events, and to create financial policies for these.
- Joel's proposal boils down to a goal of putting on financially responsible running activities within our community, while also being willing to take financial risks in putting on events.
- What Gary took away from the 2014 survey of club members is that people in the club put a lot of
  value on the sense of community, with the thought (his opinion) that races alone do not create that
  sense of community.
- Gerrit notes that Ian is already doing a lot to build community, such as film festivals.
- Sue notes that in the early years of the film festival, FLRC co-sponsored the program; she suggests that someone from the Programming Committee reach out to lan and suggest co-sponsorship (note that the film festivals are currently being co-sponsored by lan and the Old Goat store).
- Charlie suggests creating a short list of guidelines by which to assess programs as they arise;
   example guidelines:
  - o Does the event fit our mission?
  - o How does it work financially?
  - Is there public relations value for the club?
  - o How many people does it reach?
- Guidelines like these could also inform acceptance of sponsorships for our events.
- Gary invites everyone to send ideas on programs to him as representative of the Programming Committee.

#### Medical Emergency Policies/ Update First Aid Kits—Mickie Jauquet

- Mickie has been trying to get in touch with Will Fox to brief the board on first aid issues, but has not yet been successful.
- The Runnersworld website has guidelines for creating first aid kits.
- We should determine what we want in our kits and outfit the kits.
- On the policy side, Mickie will speak with firefighters and former RDs Dave Burbank and/or Gill Sharp on what to do in case of emergency (aside from calling 9-1-1).
